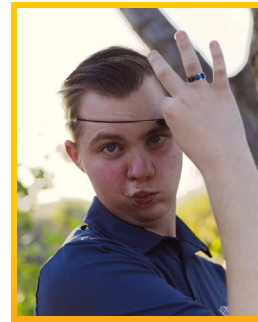

**Gavin Shurtz**, Son of Arizona Department Public Safety Captain Andrew Shurtz, was diagnosed with Ependymoma- a rare form of pediatric brain cancer- on 7-1-2022 at the age of 15. After nearly 3 years of constant battles,

losing vision in one eye, 4 brain surgeries, 1 spinal cord surgery, 70 treatments of radiation, and 2 separate sessions of chemotherapy, the cancer has returned for the 3rd time. This time invading the bones of his spine and the spinal cord. Most of Gavin's treatments for cancer and all of its effects have taken place away from home, as their and no local pediatric specialists are available in his home town. The Shurtz family have traveled all over the Country seeking Pediatric Neurosurgeons to provide treatment. The Shurtz family has found a beacon of hope as Gavin has been enrolled in a clinical trial based in Augusta, Georgia. Gavin and his father are required to travel to Georgia monthly to receive treatments which could last up to a year. While the main portion of the medical costs are covered by health insurance, the travel costs are not.

Gavin continues to be an inspiration to many. He graduated High School in 2024, 1 year early, and is currently taking college courses. When he is home, he attends early morning Bible study class with his sister and contributes to household chores. With a positive attitude and witty humor, Gavin often reminds us to see every day as an opportunity.
